

ELECTIVE UNITS (2010)
BACHELOR OF EDUCATION (Early Childhood / Primary)

You are required to undertake 4 elective units as part of the course requirements in the Bachelor of Education program.

Elective units are 'free choice' units that you can select from any Faculty across the University providing that you meet any specified pre requisite requirements. You will be required to select two electives in your first year of study and two electives in your fourth year of study.

You may use your electives to complete a minor in a particular area of interest. A minor is comprised of four units, two introductory units (first year) and two at intermediate level. If you choose to undertake a minor it is vital that you select carefully and it is strongly recommended that you seek advice from the School/s involved. This can be facilitated by discussion with relevant staff prior to enrolment or by referring to the 2010 [Course and Unit handbook](#) on the Internet. You should consider a possible emphasis in your elective studies prior to enrolment.

The following document contains a selection of potential elective units that can be studied at the Launceston and Cradle Coast campuses as well as units offered online. This is by no means an exhaustive list of units and other options may be available should you choose to source them individually by reviewing the online course and unit handbook.

If you are completing the course on campus, once you have selected your elective units it is important that you check the [class timetable](#) for the scheduling of classes to ensure they do not clash with the Education timetable.
