BACHELOR OF NURSING

GENERAL INFORMATION

The UTAS School of Nursing and Midwifery (SNM) offers the Two Year Bachelor of Nursing (BN) in New South Wales and in Tasmania. The Two Year BN is undertaken over two calendar years (six semesters) enabling students to accelerate their studies and graduate earlier. The campuses for the two year BN are in NSW at Darlinghurst with St Vincents and Mater Health Services, and at Rozelle with Sydney South West Area Health Service and South Eastern Sydney and Illawarra Area Health Service and in Tasmania; Hobart and Launceston with the Department of Health & Human Services.

Traditional face-to-face education and innovative flexible delivery, using videoconferencing, teleconferencing, pod casting, and computer supported learning. The program is presented by highly qualified academic staff supported by experienced clinicians in practice.

The clinical education program comprises on-campus clinical education including simulated learning, and clinical placements in a wide spectrum of health care agencies in both the public and private sector within NSW and Tasmania.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The SNM BN is highly regarded nationally and internationally through the excellence and quality of its graduates. Nursing graduates work in a wide range of institutional and community settings including occupational health and industry, health promotion, education, health centres and acute care hospitals. Graduates have the opportunity to undertake postgraduate studies in nursing and to work as Registered Nurses throughout Australia and overseas.

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION

On successful completion of the BN, graduates are eligible to apply for registration with the Nursing Board of Tasmania (NBT). Once registered with the NBT, graduates can then apply (under the Mutual Recognition Act) for registration with any other Nursing and Midwifery Board within Australia.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You may apply for admission to the course based on:

- Year 12 qualifications that have reached the standard necessary for university admission; or
- Previous tertiary study or qualifications, professional qualifications or work experience.

In NSW and Hobart the course is only available to Australian permanent residents or citizens.

POSTGRADUATE STUDY OPTIONS

Opportunities for further study are available at the SNM, including Honours, Graduate Certificate, Graduate Diploma, Clinical Masters, Masters by Research and PhD.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The BN aims to prepare students for a broad range of first level practice roles in community and hospital settings. Clinical practice will include metropolitan and regional placements and may include rural and remote experiences. Students will be required to travel and may need to relocate in order to undertake a clinical placement. Accommodation and travel for clinical placements will be at the student's expense.
