What are the requirements for my degree?

You need to complete 24 units, consisting of two majors (8 units each), a minor (4 units) and 4 student electives.

When choosing the student electives, you need to ensure that the total number of units in the degree complies with the ranges below:

Introductory level: a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 10 units

Intermediate level: a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 10 units

Advanced level: a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 10 units

What are student electives?

Student electives are your choice of available units from any study area across the University, provided you are eligible to enrol in them (i.e. meet any unit pre-requisites). You can take a second minor in another area through your student electives and try out different subject areas - it's your choice.
